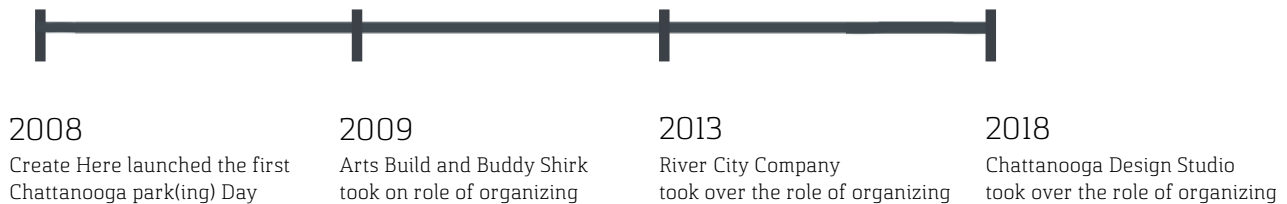

How Parking Day Came to be:

Let's go back to 2005 in San Francisco.

Rebar, a San Francisco art and design studio, decided to capitalize on the lack of public green space in the city by turning a single metered parking space into a temporary public park in downtown San Francisco. Feeding the meter for the limited two-hour slot, Rebar installed a patch of grass, a park bench, a tree and signs for pedestrians to sit and relax, in order to make their statement. Since iconic images of this unique use for an urban context were captured, Parking Day has spawned into a global movement with both individuals and organizations creating their own temporary public spaces.

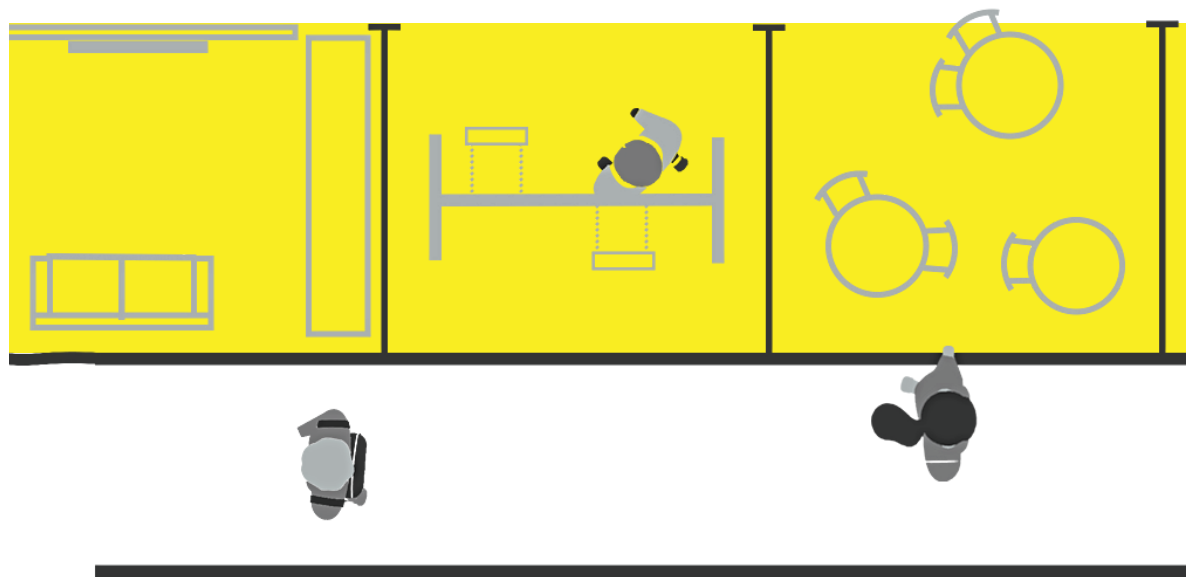
Chattanooga's Parking Day History:



What is Parking Day today?

You are part of a worldwide movement to improve the quality of the public realm and reclaim the streets for people. Your park is also a unique expression of your own ideas, creativity and identity. Think ahead to how you will easily explain what's happening to curious, skeptical or appreciative audiences you'll encounter out there.

Put forward the positive aspect of your action and remember that skeptical critics can turn into key supporters and allies if you win them over. Your generous and creative act can set the tone for other people's positive experience of public space, so appeal to their best instincts: civic pride, artistic expression, and caring for others.

Who can participate?

There is a place for everyone to be involved! Businesses, non-profits, individuals, civic groups and schools are all welcome to participate free of charge! Volunteers are also needed to help out at the parklets during the day.

Involvement:

We want to encourage widespread community use of public space! While Downtown is a great place for shops, restaurants, and apartments, it is useless without people using and enjoying the space. Chattanooga is participating in Parking Day to encourage innovative use of space in urban Downtown. We're showing support for the use of public space by demonstrating pride and a sense of collective ownership for a more beautiful downtown. We're acting in the public interest to add to the health, comfort and vitality of our city!

Responsibilities

Chattanooga Design Studio works in partnership with Chattanooga Parking Authority to cone off metered parking spaces for the day. It is up to each parker to create and execute his/her parklet. That includes but is not limited to power source, extension cords, furniture, shelter and any content needed for day of set up and break down.

At the end of the event participants are expected to leave your parking space clean of any debris, garbage and signage so that cars can resume parking in the spaces by 5:00pm

Where will it be located?

The location of the parklets will be on Broad Street between 4th Street and Aquarium Way.

Event Duration: 10:00am-4:00pm

Awards: 3:00-4:00pm

Clean up : 4:00pm-5:00pm

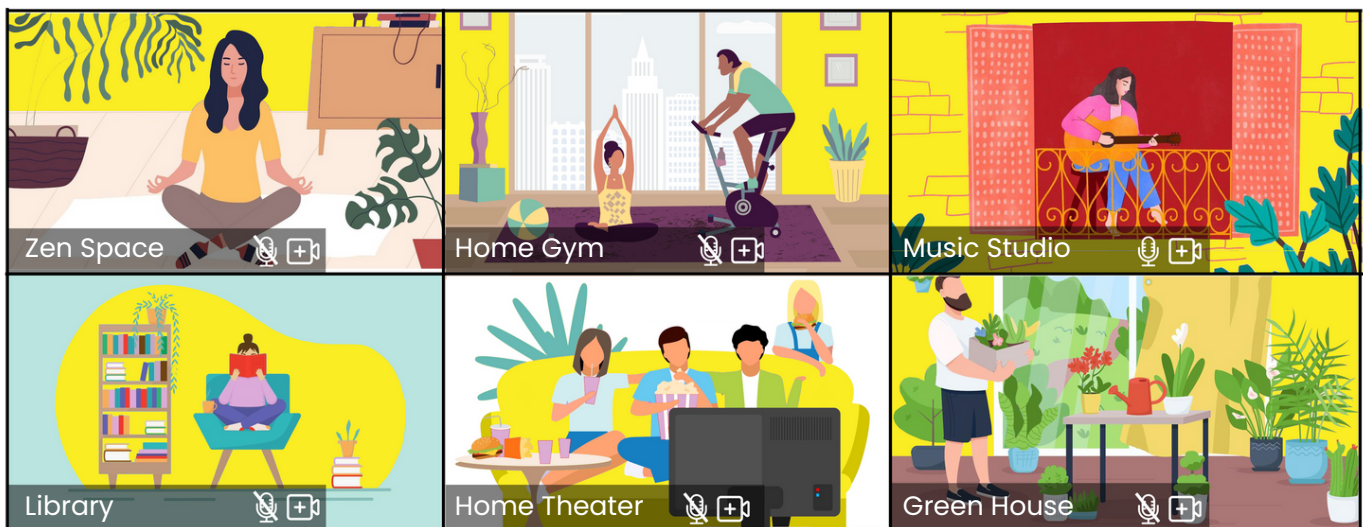
Requirements:

- Displays must stay within the bounds of the parking space. Specific dimensions of each space will be provided after registering for the event.
- No goods or services may be sold or purchased during the event.
- Signage may not contain specific offers, discounts or coupons whether related to Parking Day or not.
- Signage is allowed to present a name or logo of the company or installer. Signage associated with business, group or independent is limited to TWO signs that are no bigger than 11x17.
- Parklet designs are encouraged to face the sidewalk for pedestrian access.
- Parklet display cannot have anything blocking or crossing the road for motor traffic. This includes but is not limited to extension cords, shelters or furniture that may protrude out of the parking spot.
- Participants must have at least one member on site of their park during the duration of the event.
- No generators allowed of any kind.
- Be a good neighbor! Be aware that you'll be sharing these spaces with local businesses, pedestrians and other participants using the parklets. Be considerate of the noise, smell, activity and anything that goes beyond the parklet.

INSIDE OUT


